

Missouri Ranch Horse Association Merit Scholarship Guidelines

Application Procedures

- The Missouri Ranch Horse Association (MoRHA) provides scholarship applications to interested youth members who are planning to attend, or who are currently attending college or a certified trade school. Applications are sent to members upon request and are available on the MoRHA website at www.moranchhorse.com
- Applications should be completed in full and must be typed or printed neatly in black or blue ink. Applications that are downloaded must be completed and a hard copy returned to the MoRHA Youth Director for consideration. Incomplete or late applications will not be accepted for consideration.
- **The deadline for applications is February 28th** of each calendar year. All application materials must be emailed to:

Applicant Eligibility

- Each applicant must be a current member in good standing and have been an MoRHA member for a minimum of two (2) years to be eligible. For youth who have been MoRHA members exceeding two years, they must have actively participated in MoRHA activities during the past two (2) years. The length of MoRHA membership will be considered in evaluating each scholarship application.

Requirements to Apply

- Completed MoRHA Scholarship application form.
- 300 word essay about you and MoRHA. The essay should include but is not limited to how long you have been involved with the MoRHA and what you have gained and learned from being involved with MoRHA.
- Write a brief summary (150 words or less) about why you want to continue your education.
- Include an official school transcript.
- Two recommendations are required from: 1) MoRHA member; 2) a teacher.

Recommendation letters cannot be from a relative. Use the form provided in the application packet. The person completing the form will mail or email it directly to MoRHA.

Essay and summary must be typed, double spaced, and use Times New Roman size 12 font.

1. Write a 300 word essay about you and MoRHA. The essay should include but is not limited to how long you have been involved with the MoRHA and what you have gained and learned from being involved with MoRHA. Please do not include information about your parents' involvement.
2. Write a brief summary (150 words or less) about why you want to continue your education.
3. Include an official school transcript.
4. Two recommendations are required from: 1) MoRHA member; 2) a teacher.

Recommendation letters cannot be from a relative. Use the form provided in the application packet. The person completing the form will mail or email it directly to MoRHA.

WORK HABITS

INITIATIVE

1. Shows resourcefulness in working out plans and carrying them through.
2. Sometimes shows evidence of originality and advanced plans for carrying through ideas.
3. Inclined to take things as they come; has potential and may be capable of self-directed action, if enthused.
4. Seldom varies from established initiative.
5. Disturbed by new ideas: tendency to drift w/o plan or decision.

LEADERSHIP

1. Habitually shapes the opinions and activities of others; exerts a controlling influence.
2. Has a contributing influence upon others, though not controlling.
3. Has leadership potential, but influence is limited to small groups.
4. Has no definite influence on others, fails to meet responsibilities.
5. Avoids assuming leadership; carried along by the nearest or strongest influence. decision; revisits change.
